

Epididymitis	<p>Under 35 years old usually sexually transmitted (Chlamydia, gonorrhoea). Over 35 years old usually Gram-negative enteric, but a sexual history is essential to assess risk.</p> <p>Exclude testicular torsion esp if <20 yrs old</p> <p>Consider mumps.</p> <p>Perform MSSU and send a further 1st void urine sample to virology (white top/ universal container) for GC/Chlamydia NAAT.</p> <p>Urethral swab for GC if discharge</p> <p>Seek advice from Sandyford: partner notification required if STI is the cause</p>	<p>Ofloxacin</p> <p>Additional therapy on advice of GUM/ Sandyford centre if Gonococcus suspected</p>	<p>200mg bd</p>	<p>14 d</p>
