

Patient Advice Leaflet Community Needlestick/Bite Injury

You attended the Emergency Department today having sustained a needlestick injury

Risks:

The risk of developing an infection following this type of injury is rare. To date, in the UK, there have been no reports of HIV or Hepatitis C being acquired after a community needlestick injury. The risks of Hepatitis B are also very low

	Blood has been taken for storage.		
	Tetanus booster has been given (if required)		
	1 st dose of Hepatitis B vaccine has been given.		
	Referral made to Ad Hoc vaccination service for completion of HepB		
What needs to happen now?			
Inform your GP practice of your attendance as you will require:			
	GP may test for	Hepatitis B/C HIV	in 8, 12 and 24 weeks in 8 and 12 weeks
	For a child follow up will be arranged with paediatrics
